<p><b>What children will know and remember</b></p>		
<p>To know that the year is divided into four <b>seasons – winter, spring, summer and autumn</b></p> <p>Season is a part of a whole year ( a quarter)</p>	<p>To know there are four <b>Countries in the United Kingdom –</b> England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland and to use maps of UK to locate them knowing that Scotland is the furthest to the North, Northern Ireland is part of the island of Ireland and Wales is joined to the West of England</p>	<p>To know that tourists visit the seaside for the <b>fresh air and to bathe in the sea and to cool off when it's hot</b></p> <p>(Tourist – someone who visits a place for pleasure)</p>
<p>To know the <b>weather changes in each season and identify seasonal changes –</b> summer is generally warmer and sunnier and snow can fall in winter and it's colder and spring and autumn are the changes. Spring is when the weather starts to warm up and we often have more rain than in Summer – this is when the plants (vegetation) start to grow again as the sun warms up. Autumn is the season when the days start to feel shorter as we have less daylight moving into Winter and the temperatures start to get cooler.</p> <p>(To know which months the seasons cover)</p>	<p>To know some characteristics of the four countries of the UK:  <u>England</u> has cities like London, Manchester, and Birmingham. It has beautiful countryside with rolling hills and rivers like the Thames.  <u>Scotland</u> has rugged mountains like the Highlands, deep lakes called lochs (like Loch Ness), and lots of green forests.  <u>Wales</u> is known for its valleys, mountains like Snowdonia, and a long coastline with sandy beaches.  <u>Northern Ireland</u> has a stunning coastline with cliffs and beaches.</p> <p><u>England</u> is the most populated country in the UK and people speak English and have the traditional food of fish and chips. England is famous for its history and has many famous landmarks like Buckingham Palace.  <u>Scotland</u> has a smaller population compared to England. People in Scotland speak English, but some also speak Scottish Gaelic. The traditional dress is kilts and the instrument bagpipes is associated with Scotland  <u>Wales</u> has a smaller population than &amp; Welsh is spoken by some people alongside English. Wales is known for its mining history and beautiful countryside.  <u>Northern Ireland</u> also has a smaller population than England. People there speak English, but some also speak Irish.</p>	<p>To know that sea, caves and <b>cliffs</b> are natural – not made by humans</p>

To know Countries around the world have different climates and <b>temperatures</b> – Pakistan’s climate is dry and hot and UK is wet and cool which is due to their proximity to the equator  Temperature is how we measure how hot or cold it is	To know the UK is made up of the island Great Britain and Northern Ireland.	<b>To know that a harbour is where ships and boats moor</b>  (A harbour is where boats are safe when they are not sailing – like a car park but for boats)
To know that the weather changes over the day, often getting warmer towards the middle of the day and how to measure the temperature using a thermometer is	To know the UK is surrounded by the English channel, the North Sea, the Irish sea and the North Atlantic Ocean.
