## **Attendance**

Over the first 7 weeks of this school year you have been amazing at working with us to help improve attendance – your efforts have not gone to waste.

Our attendance today is 95.88% which is much better than this day last year when it was 93.61%.

So far this year there have been 199 days of learning missed compared to 338 days last year.

Of the 199 days of missed learning, 64.5 were due to children being on holiday.

We will continue to celebrate good attendance in school but we fully understand that, if a child is genuinely too ill to come to school, they must stay safe and warm at home.

### **Health and Fitness**

As you know, we place a great deal of importance on physical and emotional health which is why the whole school runs for 15 minutes at the start of every day.

We also offer free (or very cheap) after school clubs so that children can be active and/or sociable with their friends in a more relaxed environment. Many of the clubs have been requested by the children themselves and all are being well attended. Details of next half term's clubs will be shared on Parent Hub next week.

Some of your children have participated in sporting events outside of school and they have, almost without exception, been fantastic ambassadors for the school in terms of their attitudes and behaviour. Year 2 children have attended a multi-sports events; Key Stage 2 have had the chance to take part in the inter-schools Cross Country and we will be taking our year 3 girls and a year 5 boy to the final because they were so brilliant; some year 5 children have attended a rugby tournament at Dewsbury Rams; there has been a year 5/6 football match with another school and we have more sporting events to come.

It is our wish that every single child in school takes part in an extra-curricular activity over the coming year.

#### **Safeguarding**

In school we have a duty to keep each and every one of your children safe and we take this responsibility very seriously.

Any concern is reported to either the Designated Safeguarding Lead – DSL - (Miss Barlow) or a Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead DDSL (Mrs Wilby, Miss Massarella, Mrs Ottewell, Mrs Jogee and Mrs Shaikh)

Once a concern has been reported it is documented and then acted upon – sometimes we monitor situations, sometimes we speak to the child and sometimes we ring the parents. We will never ring Social Care without a parent's consent unless we believe that speaking to the parent first would increase the risk to the child (this is very rare).
