WHAT IS A GANG AND WHAT DOES A GANG LOOK LIKE?

PARENTS AND CARERS WILL BECOME BETTER ABLE TO IDENTIFY THE SIGNS OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S INVOLVEMENT IN CRIME AND CRIMINAL ACTIVITY, THE FACTORS THAT CONTRIBUTE TO A YOUNG PERSON BECOMING VULNERABLE AND SUSCEPTIBLE TO COUNTY LINES INVOLVEMENT AND HOW TO RECOGNISE KEY SIGNS AND INDICATORS THAT YOUNG PEOPLE ARE BEING EXPLOITED.

THE SESSION AIMS TO SUPPORT PARENTS TO UNDERSTAND HOW TO USE PRACTICAL ADVICE AND APPROACHES TO KEEP YOUNG PEOPLE SAFE.
